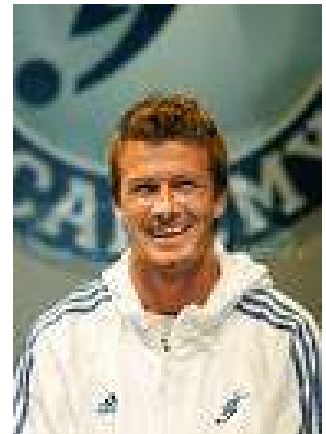
The David Beckham Academy is the realization of a dream that David had many years ago. As a boy he was lucky enough to take part in the Bobby Charlton Soccer School. (What d'ya mean, who's Bobby Charlton?) David wanted children to have a similar experience Charlie had in the Chocolate Factory, but of course without the sweets!

The Academy in London was opened in 2005. It is the largest sporting facility of its kind in Europe. It has a mas-

sive indoor arena housing two full sized, third generation, artificially turfed pitches, alongside a state-of-the-art education and administration centre.

Hebburn's players and parents travelled by train one wet August evening. The train journey was great fun with everyone taking part in games and a sports quiz organized by Stephen Rutherford. On the Friday evening, they all stayed at the Holiday Inn where the parents did some socializing. Actually, quite a lot of socializing. In fact, on the Saturday morning, some parents were heard saying that they'd never socialize again!

On the Saturday, the players and coaches spent the day at the Academy where they were coached and played football. The coaching that took place was very good, the kids were split into age



groups and the coaches concentrated on games and exercises using the ball for the correct age group. Parents meanwhile, spent the day at the O2 Arena.

Even though David wasn't there (he was in China), a fantastic time was had by all. Beckham has an academy in Los Angeles and hopes to open another in Brazil.

So, maybe next year, we'll be reporting on Hebburn's visit to Rio De Janeiro?
