### Lionel's top soccer tips

Each month, Hebburn's senior coach, Lionel Bowman, gives us all a coaching or playing tip.



*"All players should understand the difference between a defensive header and an attacking header. When heading out of defence, you should be heading the ball away from the centre of the goal and try to head at a 45 degree angle to get maximum distance. When you are attacking, head down with power to make it more difficult for the goal keeper."*
